<u>Overview:</u> A thorough understanding of World History is essential for every citizen in this rapidly changing and increasingly interconnected global society. The challenges that face humankind can only be solved by individuals within a society that can grasp the evolution of our species, our impacts on the biosphere and the complex cultural systems we have created over time and space. Social Sciences such as Geography, Economics, Anthropology, and Political Science, as well as the respective Physical Sciences, will be woven into our studies and inform our historical analysis. Truly, World History is a bottomless subject and value choices about what to include and to what depth we plumb these subjects within a single school year are heart-wrenchingly difficult. This course is meant to serve as a primer and an inspiration for the study of a lifetime.

Unit Topics:

Semester One

1. Contributions of Civilization

Paleolithic Man, Neolithic Revolution, Pillars of Civilization, River Valley Cultures

2. Empire Building

Greek and Roman Empires, Asian Dynasties, Meso-America

Semester Two

3. Revolutions

Major World Religions, Byzantium, Dark Ages, Feudalism, Renaissance, Scientific, Industrial and Green Revolutions

4. Globalization

Columbian Exchange, Colonialism, Nationalism, World Wars, Cold War, ?

Course Materials:

Text: <u>World History: The Human Experience</u> by Farah Karls. (class set, students will NOT be issued a textbook to take home.)

Online Readings and Videos: Most of our homework will be based on separate readings and excerpts from various authors. These will be posted online, and it is the student's responsibility to download documents or view video selections.

Homework:

Assignments will be posted on the class website daily and can be accessed through the Lakewood High School homepage.

For each homework assignment:

- 1.) Print off the reading or watch video.
- 2.) Highlight, annotate, and take notes to facilitate rigorous understanding. **NOTE**: Readings **WILL NOT BE** collected
- 3.) Take notes on the reading or video (outline, Cornell style, etc.). **NOTE**: Individual notes **WILL BE** collected for a grade and scored based on the *quality and completeness* of note-taking.
- 4.) Bring the reading and your notes to the next class.

Research Presentation Project: World History is vast. There are many topics with which we should be familiar but will not have the chance to explore deeply. Students will be responsible for researching and preparing an 8-10 minute slide presentation for the class on a World History event or biography of their choice. Students will be given the option to choose one of the four quarters of the year and presentations will be scheduled the last week of each quarter on a volunteer basis. Except for specific instructions at the beginning of the year and student presentations, classtime will not be devoted to these independent projects. I will coach individuals during Office Hours, but students will need to be self-directed learners while they plan and execute the work outside of class.

Grading and Class Work:

Grades are based on the following ratio: *Assessments* (tests and quizzes) totaling 60% and *Engagement* (Homework, Preparation, Classwork, Research Presentation Project) 40%. Semester grades are cumulative based on points earned throughout the semester. Grades will be based on the following scale:

A=90%-100%, B=80%-89%, C=70%-79%, D=60%-69%, F=59%-Below

Assignments turned in LATE within a week will earn 70%. After a week, 50% can be earned if turned in before the end of the 6 week grading period. Please note that reading quizzes are given nearly every class period and students who missed (excused or not excused) the previous session are expected to keep up with the reading and take the quiz along with all the other students on the day they return.
